PENALTY RANGE

FORFEITURE: \$150 minimum to \$300 maximum

REVOCAION/DISQUALIFICATION: 6-9 months (no waiting period for occupational license). Effective 09/30/05, revocation applies to all driving privileges -- commercial and noncommercial; disqualification for one (1) year from operation of commercial vehicles.

REVOCAION FOR REFUSAL: 12 months (30 day waiting period)

1. Court may order the **safety plan** to include effect on any victim or victim's family.
2. Court may order **community service work** that demonstrates adverse effects of abuse (**and a reasonable fee**).
3. Court may order a **visit to a site that demonstrates adverse effects of abuse (and a reasonable fee)**.
4. **Court may**, after a finding of inability to pay, reduce the costs or forfeiture and order the person to pay the difference toward the cost of the alcohol assessment and driver safety plan.

PENALTY RANGE

FINE AMOUNT: \$350 minimum to \$1100 maximum

JAIL (OR MONITORED HOME DETENTION): Not less than 5 days or ordered to perform not less than 30 days of community service work nor more than 6 months.

REVOCAION/DISQUALIFICATION: 12 - 18 months. Effective 09/30/05, revocation applies to all driving privileges -- commercial and noncommercial; disqualification for one (1) year from operation of commercial vehicles.

OCCUPATIONAL/COMMERCIAL LICENSE ELIGIBILITY: Effective 9/30/01, OWI offenders with two or more offenses within any five year period are eligible for an occupational license one year from the date of revocation for the offense. If not, a 60 day waiting period for the occupational license applies. Absolute sobriety during use.

Effective 9/30/05, if conviction for a second or subsequent OWI/PAC is coupled with prior OWI/PAC with commercial vehicle, disqualification for life from operating commercial vehicle.

1. Court may order the **safety plan** to include effect on any victim or victim's family.
2. Court may order **community service work** that demonstrates adverse effects of abuse **and a reasonable fee**.
3. Court may order a **visit to a site that demonstrates adverse effects of abuse (and a reasonable fee)**.
4. **Court shall**, after a finding that a person does not have the ability to pay a fine imposed under s. 346.65(2)(b) to **require the defendant to perform community service work in lieu of paying the fine imposed** or if the amount of the fine was reduced in lieu of paying the remaining amount of the fine.
5. Court may, after a finding of inability to pay, reduce the costs or fine and order the person to pay the difference toward the cost of the alcohol assessment and driver safety plan.
6. **Huber law work release privileges** shall be denied if defendant does not comply with an alcohol assessment and a driver safety plan pursuant to Wis. Stats. 303.08(10m).

FINE AMOUNT: \$600 minimum to \$2000 maximum (**EXCEPTION:** minimum and maximum fines are doubled if BAC is .17 to .199; tripled if BAC is .20 to .249; and quadrupled if BAC is .25 or above).

JAIL (OR MONITORED HOME DETENTION): 30 days - 12 months (not less than a 48 consecutive hour period in county jail).

REVOCAION/DISQUALIFICATION: 24 - 36 months. Effective 09/30/05, revocation applies to all driving privileges -- commercial and noncommercial; disqualification for one (1) year from operation of commercial vehicles.

OCCUPATIONAL/COMMERCIAL LICENSE ELIGIBILITY: Effective 9/30/01, OWI offenders with two or more offenses within any five year period are eligible for an occupational license one year from the date of revocation for the offense. If OWI offender does not have two or more offenses within any five year period, then 90-day waiting period applies. Completion of alcohol assessment/driver safety plan for occupational license and absolute sobriety during use. FINE AMOUNT: \$600 minimum to \$2000 maximum (*EXCEPTION:* minimum and maximum fines are doubled if BAC is .17 to .199; tripled if BAC is .20 to .249; and quadrupled if BAC is .25 or above.)

JAIL (OR MONITORED HOME DETENTION): 60 days - 12 months (not less than a 48 consecutive hour period in county jail).

REVOCAION/DISQUALIFICATION: 24 - 36 months (90 day waiting period and completion of alcohol assessment/driver safety plan for occupational license and absolute sobriety during use). Effective 09/30/05, revocation applies to all driving privileges -- commercial and noncommercial; disqualification for one (1) year from operation of commercial vehicles.

PROBATION OPTION: Probation is discretionary. It is not recommended on offenses with PAC of .02 through .079. For offenses of OWI and PACs of .08 and greater, it is recommended that the guideline PAC sentence be imposed and stayed and that probation then be ordered with conditions of jail, fine, and revocation two levels down on the guidelines.
